

Our enduring strength relies on the quality of our nursing staff, the trust of our clients and their families, and the commitment from our community. Our independence affords the nurses the flexibility to effectively adapt to an ever-changing health care environment, focusing on the non-acute, in-home nursing needs of vulnerable residents.

Through Covid and beyond, our staff has continuously provided services ~ safely and with steady increased need. The Board and Endowment Committee have ceaselessly worked to ensure RDNA's continued stability and sustainability, with volunteers helping to carry the load through these turbulent times. RDNA is a 501(c)(3) agency.





Agency Facts



- ~ 25% of residents were 65+
- ~ of whom, 44% lived alone
- ~ mean Social Security was \$22,364

For residents 75 and older:

- ~ 35% had 3 or more chronic health conditions
- ~ 1 in 5 who were single lived below the poverty level

RDNA nurses are serving at capacity, annually visiting 200 un-duplicated residents living independently in Rockland ~ Thomaston ~ Owls Head ~ Warren ~ St. George ~ South Thomaston ~ Cushing ~ Union

Average client age is 82 77% of clients are 75 or older 46% are 85 or older, with the oldest clients 102

Nursing staff consists of a Clinical Care Director (RN) and (part-time) 4 RNs and 2 LPNs Combined 220+ years of nursing experience

2023 Rose Hip Basket Social Eliza Steele Memorial Garden, MacDougal Park, Rockland


